• SEN sessions are due to be on Friday's in August (the 4th, 11th, 25th and 1st September) from 2pm-3pm. Planned activities for each of those dates are nature crafts (sticking with leaves and grasses and flowers etc and also adding different materials to homemade playdough), bug hunting week 2, animal handling week 3 and then sensory play week 4 (this will mostly be a water play session with lots of water trays, bubbles and water beads).

We will have the posters out next week with details on how to book for the sessions which will be through Eventbrite, the SEN sessions will be £4 per child.

Challengers Playschemes (4 to 12 year olds)

The playschemes are places for disabled and non disabled children aged 4 to 12 to make new friends and have fun. Activities include art, noisy and active play (bouncy castles, soft play and rough and tumble), outside space for accessible bikes, trikes, go karts, ball games, sand and water play and mucking about as well as quiet space for curling up with a book and stories. They run at venues in Esher, Farnham and Guildford.

InterAKtive is for families who have a child or children on the autism spectrum, or those with a similar communication difficulty. Linden Bridge School is the "hub" of the playscheme. Facilities at the site include a play area, a modern swimming pool, and a block of classrooms, where activities such as art and crafts and cookery are carried out. The whole area is secure. What is the Holiday Activities and Food Programme (HAF)

The Holiday Activities and Food Programme (HAF) is a great way for your child to have fun during the school holidays. Eligible children will have the opportunity to make new friends, take part in a variety of exciting activities, and they will have a healthy meal each day. Each activity session must last for at least four hours a day and operates in the following school holidays.

- Easter
- Summer
- Christmas

The entitlement for each eligible child is:

- 4 days for 4 hours during Easter
- •16 days for 4 hours during Summer
- 4 days for 4 hours during Christmas

The next delivery period is 24 July to 1 September 2023. Bookings will open on 24 June.

Children with SEND that attend main stream schools can take part in most HAF activities. Children attending specialist schools that require additional support will most likely have an Educational Health Care Plan and be known to the 0-25 Disability Team.
